Summer Funding Round Up 2024

General/Core Costs/Miscellaneous

Alec Dickson Trust: Grants of £500 are available to support volunteering projects in the UK, organised and run by young people (aged 30 years and younger). **Deadline 1**st **July.**

<u>Wolfson Foundation</u>: Discretionary grants for the funding of capital infrastructure in science and medicine, arts and humanities, heritage, education, health and disability. **Deadline 1**st **July.**

Co-Op Local Community Fund: Grants are available for small, locally based voluntary and community groups to support projects which benefit local communities around Co-op food stores and funeral homes across the UK. **Deadline 7**th **July.**

Steel Charitable Trust: Discretionary grants are available to registered charities in the UK working in the areas of arts and heritage, education, environment, health, or social and economic disadvantage. **Deadline 11**th **July.**

Hedley Foundation: Grants up to £5000 are available to smaller charities undertaking projects for young people, the disabled, terminally ill patients and others in need. **Deadline 17th July.**

ScottishPower Foundation - General Grants: Grants of up to £150,000 to registered charities in the UK for projects that support education, environmental protection, arts, culture and social initiatives. **Deadline 19**th **July.**

<u>Groundwork - One Stop Community Partnership Programme</u>: Grants programme for community groups, operating within two miles of a One Stop store, who are working to: tackle food poverty; support the vulnerable; support the elderly; support low income families; running youth sports teams; reducing/recycling waste; improving the environment. **Deadline 26**th **July.**

Woodward Charitable Trust - General Grants: Funding core costs of smaller registered charities in the UK working in the following areas: isolated children and young people, disadvantaged families, and prisoners and ex-offenders. **Deadline 26**th **July.**

Asda Foundation - Investing in Spaces and Places Grant: Grants up to £25,000 are available for small, local groups in the UK to improve community spaces and places where local people can be together and thrive. **Deadline 28**th **July.**

Skipton Building Society Charitable Foundation: Grants up to £6000 to UK registered charities for charitable work in the UK that benefits children, through their education and/or welfare, youth projects, and the elderly and their welfare. **Deadline 31**st **July.**

Seven Friends Foundation: Grants from £300 to £3000 to causes which are unpopular or do not receive widespread attention in the UK, particularly in deprived areas. **Deadline 1**st **August.**

B&Q Foundation Grants: One-off grants are available to UK registered charities for projects that improve homes and communities spaces for those who are experiencing homelessness, in financial hardship, impacted by health, disability or other disadvantage or distress. **Deadline 9th August.**

Better Community Business Network Grant Initiative: A small number of grants are available each year to small not-for-profit groups with projects that address a community issue or support a local community initiative; and provide benefits to the local community. **Deadline 9**th **August.**

Screwfix Foundation: Grants to UK registered charities and not-for-profit organisations for projects that improve, fix, and repair buildings, homes and facilities specifically used by people in need across the UK. **Deadline 10**th **August.**

<u>Charles Hayward Foundation</u>: Grants of up to £75,000 available to UK registered charities for projects in the following categories: Heritage and Conservation; Social and Criminal Justice; Overseas; and Older People. **Deadline 16**th **August.**

Woodroffe Benton Foundation - Small Grants Programme: Supports small charities that provide care for the sick and elderly, conserve and improve the environment, promote education, and help those in need as a result of disaster or as a consequence of social and economic circumstances. **Deadline 31**st **August.**

<u>Green Hall Foundation</u>: Grants for UK registered charities to fund special projects or the purchase of equipment that will improve lives among the sick, the elderly, the disabled and the disadvantaged. **Deadline 3**rd **September.**

<u>Grocers Charity</u>: One-off grants to small UK registered charities for work in the specific areas of: relief of poverty, disability and inclusion, the elderly, health, military, environment and conservation, and the arts and heritage. **Deadline 6**th **September.**

<u>D'Oyly Carte Charitable Trust</u>: Grants up to £6000 for charities working in the UK in the areas of advancement of the arts, health and medical welfare, and improvement or protection of the environment. **Deadline 24**th **September.**

Hardship & Poverty

<u>Social Investment Business - Cost of Living Fund</u>: Discretionary unrestricted grants are available for UK charities and social enterprises based and delivering their work in England who are supporting people impacted by the cost-of-living crisis. The grant is to be used alongside a loan from the SIB Recovery Loan Fund. **Deadline 3**rd **July.**

Islamic Relief UK Grants Programme: Grants for charitable organisations across the UK to deliver projects and activities that support marginalised people, including women, young people, and refugees, and help build resilience to poverty. **Deadline 8**th **July.**

Austin and Hope Pilkington Trust: Current funding round focuses on food poverty. Grants of £5000 for UK registered charities. **Deadline 31**st **July.**

Money Saving Expert (MSE) Charity: A limited number of grants are available to small to medium-sized UK not-for-profit organisations that deliver activities which make a lasting impact on how people think, behave and manage their money. **Deadline 31**st **July.**

Quaker Housing Trust: Grants and loans are available for a wide range of charitable social housing projects in Britain with a focus on helping small charitable organisations to enhance the quality of their housing provision or to create new homes. **Deadline 4**th **September.**

Leeds Building Society Foundation: Grants of up to £100,000 to support projects that improve the health, wellbeing and financial literacy of people who are experiencing homelessness.

Deadline 9th September.

Health, Social Care and Wellbeing

<u>Dan Maskell Tennis Trust</u>: Small grants are available to help disabled people in the UK to play tennis through the purchase of wheelchairs, tennis equipment and grants for coaching. **Deadline 7**th **July.**

Heart Research UK - Healthy Heart Grants: Funding of up to £15,000 for new projects being delivered in small local communities that work with adults and that actively promote heart health or reduce the risk of heart disease through primary or secondary prevention. **Deadline 10**th **July.**

Hospital Saturday Fund: One-off grants of up to £10,000 are available to registered medically related charities in the UK and Republic of Ireland for medical capital projects, medical care or research, medical training and running costs. **Deadline 10**th **July.**

Inman Charity: Grants of up to £25,000 are available for UK registered charities carrying out medical, social welfare or general welfare activities within the UK. **Deadline 31**st **August.**

<u>Ulverscroft Foundation</u>: The Foundation provides funding of up to £500,000 for projects in the UK that benefit visually impaired people. **Deadline 15**th **September.**

<u>Department of Health and Social Care – Community Automated External Defibrillators</u>
<u>Fund:</u> Grants for community organisations to buy an automated external defibrillators (AED) to install in a public place. Deadline 21st September.

Environment and Energy

Energy Redress Scheme - Carbon Emissions Reduction and Innovation Funds: Grants for not-for-profit groups in Great Britain for projects that empower householders to reduce their carbon emissions and engage positively with the transition to net zero and for the development of innovative products and services related to energy. **Deadline 8**th **July.**

Energy Redress Scheme - Main Fund and Small Project Fund: Grants to registered charities for projects supporting people in or at risk of fuel poverty across England, Scotland and Wales. **Deadline 8**th **July.**

Heat Network Efficiency Scheme (HNES): Grants for organisations operating across the public, private and third sectors in England and Wales to upgrade existing heat networks to reduce emissions and energy costs for households. **Deadline 26**th **July.**

ORIT Impact Fund: Grants of up to £10,000 to charities and constituted community organisations across the UK for projects promoting a just transition to net zero. **Deadline 1**st **August.**

Stanley Smith Horticultural Trust: Discretionary grants for projects to further the advancement of horticulture in the UK and abroad and promote biodiversity. **Deadline 15**th **August.**

Rewilding Britain - Rewilding Innovation Fund: This fund aims to foster new and ambitious community rewilding projects, and to remove barriers to rewilding projects within Britain,

whether they're at the early planning stages or want to move a project one step wilder. **Dead** line 30th August.

British Ecological Society - Outreach and Engagement Grants: Funding of up to £2,000 for individuals, teams and organisations to engage public audiences with the excitement of ecological science. Deadline 11th September.

Veolia's Sustainability Fund (with Crowdfunding): Funding to support projects that make a positive, sustainable difference to local areas and deliver long-term social and environmental benefits with the aim of empowering local people to take positive action in their local area. **Deadline 30**th **September.**

Education, Children and Young People

IOP Public Engagement Grant Scheme: Grants for physics-based projects in the UK or Ireland that improve the relationship with physics of young people and their influencers, including their parents and carers. **Deadline 1**st **July.**

The Phoenix Way – Children and Youth Round: Grants are available for not-for-profit organisations, and charities across England and Wales to deliver projects and activities that work with Black and racially minoritised children and young people to prevent and reduce violence. **Deadline 3**rd **July.**

Freelands Foundation Inclusive Practices Fund 2024: Grants of up to £50,000 for registered charities and not-for-profit organisations to reimagine engagement and education; aiming to foster belonging and connection between young people in primary and secondary school, their teachers and visual arts spaces. **Deadline 19**th **July.**

Ironmongers' Company: Grants of up to £10,000 for projects in the UK that provide opportunities for disadvantaged children and young people under the age of 25 years to fulfil their potential. **Deadline 31st July.**

<u>Baily Thomas Charitable Fund</u>: Grants are available to voluntary organisations, charities and schools in the UK to assist with the care and relief of children, young people and adults with learning disabilities in the UK. **Deadline 1**st **August.**

Ironmongers' Company – Charitable Grants for STEM Projects: Funding is intended to support charities in the UK with projects to encourage young people, in particular those between 12 and 18 from disadvantaged backgrounds, to study science subjects and go on to further education or training in STEM related subjects. **Deadline 1**st **August.**

7stars Foundation: The foundation makes grants to projects which support young people (16 years and under) who are challenged by abuse or addiction, who are young carers, or who are homeless/without a safe place to call home. **Deadline 31**st **August.**

Kelly Family Charitable Trust: Funding of up to £5000 for charities to support initiatives that encourage families to work together to overcome challenges. **Deadline 1**st **September.**

<u>Cash for Kids - Sports Challenge</u>: Discretionary awards to grassroots junior community sports groups to engage children and young people who are disadvantaged or disabled to be more involved in physical activities. **Deadline 2**nd **September.**

Learning through Landscapes – Local School Nature Grants: £500 to promote outdoor learning among young children by providing schools and early years providers with outdoor resources and training. **Deadline 6**th **July.**

Gender, Race, Migration, Social Justice

Weaver's Company Benevolent Fund: Grants are available for UK registered charities and charitable incorporated organisations that can demonstrate impact with ex-offenders, young offenders or young people at risk of offending, either within a local area or nationally. **Deadline 4**th **July.**

Hilden Charitable Fund: Grants of up to £7,000 for charitable organisations working in the areas of penal affairs and asylum seekers and refugees in the UK. **Deadline 11**th **July.**

A B Charitable Trust: Grants up to £30,000 for small to medium-sized charities registered and working in the UK that defend human rights and promote respect for vulnerable individuals.

Deadline 26th July.

Rosa - Stand With Us Fund: Grants up to £25,000 for not-for-profit women's and girls' organisations delivering frontline services in the UK addressing male violence against women and girls. **Deadline 30**th **July.**

Older People

Home Instead Charities: Grants of £1500 for small grassroots community groups and small local registered charities that are providing activities and projects to prevent social isolation and loneliness for older people (the over 55s) in the UK. **Deadline 31**st **July.**

McCarthy Stone Foundation - Community Grants: For the current round, projects should focus on one-to-one initiatives to alleviate loneliness for people over 65 years old in Great Britain. **Deadline 23**rd **August.**

W G Edwards Charitable Foundation: Grants up to £10,000 to UK-based charities that can demonstrate how they are making the lives of older people (over the age of 65 years) better. **Deadline 10**th **September.**

Business, Digital Skills, Employment

The Society Foundation: Grants to UK registered charities and charitable organisations across the UK that are seeking to help specific groups of people (ex-offenders, recently homeless or vulnerably housed, young people not in education, employment or training) move towards paid employment. **Deadline 8**th **July.**

<u>Trading for Good - Community Business Funded Programme:</u> A business development learning programme and match trading grant are available to support locally rooted community businesses in England to become stronger and more sustainable. **Deadline 24**th **July.**

Shackleton Foundation Grant: Seed funding to inspirational leaders and early stage social enterprises in the UK to establish their own non-profit ventures with the potential to provide solutions to social problems faced by disadvantaged and socially marginalised young people. **Deadline 29**th **July.**

Thomas Wall Trust - Grants for Registered Charities: Grants are available for UK registered charities for specific projects that improves communication skills for disadvantaged adults and supports NEET people into employment. **Deadline 16**th **September.**

Churches

National Churches Trust - Large Grants Programme: Grants of up to £50,000 are available to support the conservation and sustainable use of church buildings in the UK, focusing on larger and more complex projects with priority given to urgent structural repairs or the introduction of kitchens and accessible toilets. **Deadline 2**nd **July.**

Wolfson Fabric Repair Grants: Grants are available to support essential fabric repairs in architecturally or historically significant Christian church buildings in the UK. **Deadline 2**nd **July.**

Congregational and General Charitable Trust Grants: Grants of up to £25,000 are available to support capital works on church buildings or towards the capital costs of church community projects in the UK. **Deadline 1**st **August.**

National Churches Trust - Cherish Grants: The funding is for listed and unlisted Christian places of worship, of any denomination, to help with the costs of urgent and essential maintenance and repair projects as well as the costs of developing a church building project. **Deadline 13**th **August.**

William and Jane Morris Fund (Church Conservation Grants): Grants are available to churches, chapels and other places of worship in the UK for the conservation of decorative features and monuments. **Deadline 31**st **August.**

Animals

Pets Foundation - Preventing Pet Relinquishment Grants: Grants up to £80,000 for projects which aim to keep pets with their owners and out of rescue, including projects providing emergency pet fostering for people facing crisis, subsidised veterinary care, neutering schemes and pet food banks. Deadline 31st July.

Jean Sainsbury Animal Welfare Trust: Grants to animal welfare charities for projects or activities in the UK that benefit and protect animals, relieve the suffering of animals, address the conservation of wildlife or encourage a greater understanding of animals. **Deadline 1**st **September.**

Veterans

Armed Forces Families Fund - Early Years Programme: Grants of £5000-£50,000 for projects lasting up to two years which help enhance early childhood education and childcare settings of young children from Armed Forces families. **Deadline 24**th **July.**

<u>Veterans' Foundation</u>: Grants for small and medium-sized charities and not-for-profit organisations that provide support to those in need among serving Armed Forces personnel, veterans, operationally qualified seafarers and their immediate families across the UK. **Deadline 30**th **July.**
